Assignment Details

- (a) **Draw a map of Illinois.** Find and mark the following places: Antioch, the IL state capital, and the Illinois River. Then choose three other places that interest you and mark them on your map, as well. Write two sentences about each place you added to tell me what you found interesting about those places. Take a picture of your map and upload it along with your writing.
- (b) **Antioch History!** Check out this [site](#). In your own words, write a summary of at least five sentences telling what you learned about our town's past.
- (c) **April Showers Bring...Mayflowers!** The Mayflower brought the Pilgrims to the United States from England. Watch this [video](#) to learn more about the Mayflower. Draw a picture of the Mayflower and write three facts that you learned about it below your picture. Take a picture of your drawing to upload.
- (d) **I Pledge Allegiance!** We say the Pledge of Allegiance every day in school, but do you know where the Pledge came from? Check out this [site](#) to learn more about the history of the Pledge. Write five new facts that you learned about the Pledge of Allegiance.
- (e) **The History of Me!** Create a timeline of your life. Start with the day you were born and add in at least five important events that have happened since that day. Be sure to include the dates of the events and put them in the correct order on your timeline. Add some drawings to make it colorful!
- (f) **Fireworks on the Fourth!** Fireworks have been used to celebrate Independence Day in our country for as long as we've celebrated that day. Look at this [site](#) to find out why. Then write a five sentence summary in your own words that explains what you learned.
- (g) **I Scream, You Scream!** It wouldn't be summertime without ice cream. Learn about the history of ice cream by reading this [information](#). Write down five facts that you learned about ice cream. Then, for Fact #6, tell me what your favorite ice cream flavor is.
- (h) **All About Lake Michigan!** Lake Michigan is very important to us in this area. Draw a map to show where it is in the United States. Then look at this [website](#) to find three interesting facts about Lake Michigan. Write two sentences about each of those facts.
- (i) **US Symbols!** There are many symbols that are used to represent the United States. Learn about some of them in this [video clip](#). Choose your favorite symbol and draw a picture of it.
- (j) **Rock the Vote!** In the United States, the citizens get to choose who they want to be president by voting. Watch this [video clip](#) and then write a five sentence paragraph about why it is important to vote.
- (k) **Change the World!** Kid President wants you to help change the world. Watch his [video](#) and draw a picture of yourself doing something to change the world. Write a sentence underneath your picture to tell what you are doing to change the world.
- (l) **50 States!** Using a blank Doc, write the names of all fifty states in alphabetical order. Be sure to spell them correctly and start them all with capital letters!
- (m) **My Community!** Whether you've lived in Antioch all of your life or you just moved into the area, Antioch is now your community. Write a list of your ten favorite things about living in Antioch and draw a picture of one of them.

- (n) Soybean Summer!** Soybeans are among the largest crops exported by the United States. Check out this [site](#) to learn more about them. Then write down five facts you learned about the history of soybeans and how they are used.
- (o) Lady Liberty!** The Statue of Liberty is an important symbol in the United States. Read [this information](#) and write five new facts that you learned about The Statue of Liberty.
- (p) Civil Rights!** Learn about the history of Civil Rights in the United States by watching this [video clip](#). Write down five things that you learned about Civil Rights and two things that you can do to be a good friend to someone who is different from you.
